WMM4A Monthly Meeting June 13th - brief notes

Words in remembrance of Arky Markham, longtime Single Payer advocate in western Mass. and social justice warrior who passed away on June 11th at age 103.

Discussion about outreach for the Single Payer ballot question and general public education this summer and fall:

- Plan in two phases Phase One: up until the primaries on Sept. 4th. Include a focus on keeping Single Payer as a key issue on the minds of voters and candidates. Phase Two: leading up to the Nov. 4 elections a more specific focus on educating about the ballot question itself and encouraging people to "vote single payer."
- Coordination at different levels: **Local hubs** will coordinate activity in their communities, identifying candidate forums and other opportunities for outreach and media attention. The **Steering Committee** will coordinate support including training, messaging, literature, and fundraising.
- Beth Eisenberg will be coordinating training; George Coling media; Deborah Levenson messaging and literature. Nancy Talanian is our Treasurer.

Here are suggestions the group came up with for possible questions to ask candidates at forums or other events this summer:

- Do you support a Single Payer system for Mass? Why?

- What will you do to help bring the legislation out of committee?

— What is your understanding of how Single Payer would be financed at the state level, as proposed in the legislation?

— What skills would you bring to the process of discussing and advocating for Single Payer?

— In order to build support for Medicare for All in Mass., who will you work with and how will you do it?

— What have you done as a private citizen — or as a candidate or legislator — to advance Single Payer?

— Would you help to form an advocacy group in the legislature - outside of the committee structure - to advance Medicare for All?
