Question #1: Do you support a Single Payer healthcare system for Massachusetts?

Yes.

Question #2: If yes, why? If no, how would you propose making health care truly affordable for everyone in your district and the Commonwealth while also bringing down the rising cost of healthcare?

I know first hand how deeply our healthcare system is broken. Several years ago, my father who was a Correctional Officer with the State of MA was diagnosed with Stage 4 cancer, he was given several months to live. He fought cancer for two years, but even with a great middle class job and "good" insurance, his medical bills skyrocketed.

My father lost his battle with cancer at 50, and that required us to sell his home to cover the cost of his medical bills.

Here in Hampden, we have some of the greatest disparities in health outcomes in the country. MA residents pay 31% more for healthcare than any state in the country, and this region has the worst air to breathe for people with Asthma in US.

We need a new system and new ideas to address the ongoing cost of healthcare in this state.
